## 90 Day Prayer Initiative

April 28, 2019

**First Presbyterian in North Palm Beach is a special church.** It's been my church since 1997. My sons grew up in Sunday School here, were Wednesday night regulars and devotees of Team.

Our family has appreciated the emphasis here on connecting with God's work around the world and students in our backyard. We have loved watching young people develop into leaders as they have been given opportunities to grow through internships. Steve and I love the high quality music we hear week after week and the stability of our pastoral leadership.

But all around First Pres, **change is happening.** Fewer folks in the surrounding community are taking the time for weekly worship. More and more children are growing up without any faith influence. The wider culture has less tolerance for talk of God in public spaces.

As changes happen outside the church, they also are happening inside. Our beloved Pastor Lucky is beginning to plan his retirement. While we have plenty of time before it happens, we are looking to the future and wondering what it will be like at First Pres. How will God work in our community as we go forward?

The more we think about the changes inside and outside the church, the clearer it becomes that there are **many possible paths** for us to take but some of them will not be healthy paths. We need God's guidance and provision. Only by seeking God together in prayer can we as a congregation find the path forward in this new season.

That is why the Session has asked me to lead the congregation in 90 days of focused corporate prayer for **God's vision for our future.** Next week I will address this initiative in my sermon and introduce you to the Weekly Prayer Guides that will help us pray together through the months of May, June and July.

These **Weekly Prayer Guides** will be published in the bulletin and on the web site. We know there are many faithful folks in our congregation praying. Our goal is for us to pray in unity, that is, to pray as a church in the same direction.

*Would you take **5 minutes today** to pray for our church to listen to God about how we are to fulfill our mission: "Equipping People to Pursue and Share Gospel Driven Lives"?*

I am excited to have your partnership. Let's join together in prayer for God's guidance.

## 90 Day Prayer Initiative Prayer Guide for May 5, 2019

On Paul's second missionary journey, he and Silas had plans about where to go to preach the news about Jesus, but they found that the Holy Spirit had other plans. The Spirit kept them from preaching the word where they had planned to go. When they tried a different place, they again found that God would not allow them to go. Finally, God sent a vision in the night giving them clear direction: "A man from Macedonia in northern Greece was standing there, pleading with [Paul], "Come over to Macedonia and help us!" So we decided to leave for Macedonia at once, having concluded that God was calling us to preach the Good News there." (Acts 16:9-10)

We, too, have plans for our church's ministry. How can we be sure that our plans line up with God's vision for our Church?

This week let's begin our 90 days of prayer by asking God to develop a deep **desire in all of us to hear from him**. Let's pray that we will be able to put aside our own desires and **together seek God's vision** for our future.

## 90 DAY PRAYER CHALLENGE

Prayer Guide #2 for May 12<sup>th</sup>, 2019

One of our Core Values at FPBNPB is that we are **Biblically Rooted**. This means we believe the Bible is God's Word and the primary means by which we know Him. God's commands and promises are the pathway to life, blessing and wholeness. In Psalm 119 this is pictured beautifully.

This week's prayer guide will focus on that value. As in all the prayer guides, we want you to focus on ever increasing circles as you pray; for yourself, your family, your friends, FPCNPB (leadership, staff, members), our neighborhood, and globally. As you read and pray, try and keep in mind the core value of being Biblically Rooted.

Read aloud Psalm 119:105-117

Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. I have sworn an oath and confirmed it, to keep your righteous rules. I am severely afflicted; give me life, O LORD, according to your word! Accept my freewill offerings of praise, O LORD, and teach me your rules. I hold my life in my hand continually, but I do not forget your law. The wicked have laid a snare for me, but I do not stray from your precepts. Your testimonies are my heritage forever, for

they are the joy of my heart. I incline my heart to perform your statutes forever, to the end. I hate the double-minded, but I love your law. You are my hiding place and my shield; I hope in your word. Depart from me, you evildoers, that I may keep the commandments of my God. Uphold me according to your promise, that I may live, and let me not be put to shame in my hope! Hold me up, that I may be safe and have regard for your statutes continually!

Read it aloud a second time pausing to pray between words or lines.

If there are things each verse brings to mind, pray for them. This is not a timed exercise and there is no right or wrong way to do this. Just allow yourself to pray for what comes to mind.

If you are doing this exercise with your family or a small group of friends, take turns reading each verse and praying between them.

If you have small children, try walking in the dark with a flashlight pointed at your feet. Talk and pray about how God's word can help us along our way.

**Prayer Guide #3 – May 19, 2019**  
**Caring Deeply**

People’s lives can be transformed when they experience the care of another person. It is our hope that in being a part of the First Pres family, you experience being deeply loved and cared for.

Reflect on how you have been cared for at First Pres. Have you felt God’s love through your interactions here? Give thanks to God for that love if you have felt it, or tell God about your frustration in not feeling it.

Read the following two verses:

Romans 12:10 (NIV)

“Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves.”

Ephesians 4:32 (ESV)

“Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.”

What are some ways you can be kind and tenderhearted toward others? How has God gifted you to care? Would it be to take a meal to someone, write a note, visit someone, or offer to buy groceries for someone who can’t go shopping? Maybe it would be just to listen to someone. Praying for one another is also a significant way to express your care for others.

Sit a moment with God in silence, asking for Him to show you how you can show care and love for others. Ask God to guide you and show you who specifically you can care for. Perhaps it will be for someone younger than you or older than you. Maybe it will be a family member, neighbor, friend, co-worker, classmate, a single parent, a college student, a young mom, an ill or home-bound person, or someone who has lost a loved one.

This week, pray for opportunities to love and care for one another. Pray that God will bring people to mind and will show you ways to demonstrate His love and care. Be watchful and thankful for each opportunity!

For Parents: Children are eager to show love to others. Involve your child in praying about who needs to feel the love of God and help your child find some way to share it.

(NASB)

As you ponder these verses, think about how this kind of love would affect our serving together inside and outside the church.

Where does this kind of love come from? Galatians 5:22

What effect might it have on our community? John 13:35

Take a few minutes to read over these verses a couple of times, listening for one phrase or word that seems to stand out to you. Let that word become a prayer to God for our congregation.

Pray that by the power of the Holy Spirit we will serve together unified by a godly love for one another and our community. Pray for God's direction for how we can serve our church and community together.

***James 3:13-18***

*“Who is wise and understanding among you? By his good conduct, let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom. But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.”*

This Scripture draws a very distinct contrast between two types of wisdom - an earthly wisdom and a godly wisdom, or “the wisdom that comes down from above.” We see that there is one kind of wisdom that is exercised by humans, of human origin. On the other hand, there is a true kind of wisdom that is exercised by humans, but of divine origin. One wisdom is heavenly, spiritual, and godly. The other is earthly, unspiritual, and ungodly.

We know that our Father will graciously provide wisdom when we humbly petition Him for it. It is good to pray often for wisdom for ourselves, and extremely crucial to pray it for our leaders.

Use James 3:17 as a guide for praying for our leaders: ***“The wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy, and good fruits, impartial and sincere.”***

**Prayer Guide...**

- First, begin by praying for our leaders’ **purity**.
- Pray that our leaders would love **peace** and strive to be peacemakers.
- Pray for our leaders to be **gentle** in all circumstances, with their words and their actions.
- Pray that our leaders would be excellent **listeners** to one another.
- Pray that our leaders would embrace God’s mercy for themselves, and reciprocate God’s **mercy** to others.
- Pray that there would be **impartiality** in our leadership, that our leaders would avoid playing favorites and treat all with fairness.
- Pray that our leaders would practice what they preach, and be **sincere** in all their ways.

**Prayer Guide...**

- Pray that the Lord would open your heart to vulnerability and **guide you personally** in how you can be sharing your testimony for His glory.

## 90 Day Prayer Challenge

Prayer Guide #7 – June 16, 2019

### Stewarding Your Resources and Investing in Others

Acts 4:32-37 All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they shared everything they had. With great power the apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and much grace was upon them all. There were no needy persons among them. For from time to time those who owned lands or houses sold them, brought the money from the sales and put it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to anyone as he had need. Joseph, a Levite from Cyprus, whom the apostles called Barnabas (which means Son of Encouragement) sold a field he owned and brought the money and put it at the apostles' feet.

This scripture passage records the story of the believers who shared their possessions with each other. If they knew there was a need, they took action and gave from their own finances and possessions. They invested in others by putting their needs ahead of their own. The Bible calls the way they shared what they had with each other "stewardship."

Take a minute to reflect in God's presence. Can you think of a time when someone reached out to meet a need for you? **Give thanks** to God for those he has used to meet your needs.

How may God be calling you to share your finances and possessions with others? This week ask God to show you **how you can share** what you have with others. Pray that God will bring people to mind who are in need. Be aware and be watchful!

Parents, encourage your children to be aware and eager to share with classmates, neighbors, and friends who might have a need. Pray together for those to whom God would want you to reach out.

Pray that First Presbyterian may be **marked by selfless generosity** toward both those inside and those outside our congregation.

Integrity

***One who pursues and shares a gospel driven life...  
walks with integrity and speaks the truth.***

Ask God to speak to you as you read these verses over several times:

<sup>8</sup> He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God? Micah 6:8 (ESV)

Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. Ephesians 4:25 (ESV)

<sup>1</sup> O Lord, who shall sojourn in your tent? Who shall dwell on your holy hill?

<sup>2</sup> He who walks blamelessly and does what is right and speaks truth in his heart; Psalm 15:1-2 (ESV)

**Sit quietly in God's presence** asking him to help you see in what ways your life reflects his character. **Give thanks** for God's work in your heart to help you in those areas.

In what ways does your life fail to reflect God's character?

**Confess** your failure to God.

Be **reassured that God loves you** and is working to change you.

Pray that God would transform you from the inside out by his love. May God will give us the faith and courage to do the right thing even when it is costly.

Pray that we at First Pres will be people who by **God's grace and power will live lives of integrity**, justice and righteousness with humility and lovingkindness, that we would seek to reflect the Lord Jesus Christ in our everyday lives.

**For families:**

One definition of integrity is that our words match our actions. Help your children think about what that means and pray with them for courage to do what is right.

## 90 Day Prayer Challenge Prayer Guide for June 30 Strategy

We at First Presbyterian church want to have a clear ministry strategy. Think of Strategy as a pattern of participation. It reveals places and rhythms of being involved. It shows how every major environment (time and place at church) is a part of a discipleship pathway.

It is easy for us who attend regularly to know where everything is and how everything works. Imagine what it's like for someone stepping foot into our church for the first time. A strategy will help all who attend First Pres, whether it's the first time or the 200<sup>th</sup> time, know how to get involved.

This week's prayer guide will focus on the idea of being strategic. As you pray, focus on ever increasing circles. Pray for yourself, your family, your friends, FPCNPB (leadership, staff, members), our neighborhood, and our world. As you read and pray try and keep in mind the idea of being strategic in ministry.

Read Acts 17:16-34

When Paul was in Athens he is described as "deeply distressed" due to the multitude of idols in the city.

- Pray for those that you know that are lost
- Pray about our reactions and interactions with those who don't know Jesus

Paul decides the best strategy to communicate the gospel to them is to use something they know and understand. This idea of an "unknown god."

- Pray about how we communicate the gospel to those who we know. Pray that we would do so with imagination, strategy, hope and love.
- Pray for visitors and how you would want them to feel or what you would want them to experience as they come to First Presbyterian Church.

Finish by reading Psalm 127

- Pray that as we plan and strategize that we continue to rely on God to build his kingdom.
- Pray that you would trust and believe that it is God who makes our efforts a success
- Pray that we all would trust and believe that this church belongs to God and that our growth and ability to reach the lost is reliant on God's work.

Prayer Guide #10 – July 7, 2019  
**God's Peace**

Philippians 4:4-9

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! **5**Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. **6**Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. **7**And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. **8**Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things. **9**Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me – put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.

**Settle yourself in silence** for a moment and ask God to meet you as you meditate on this passage.

Read the passage out loud slowly, **listening for a word or phrase** that sticks in your mind. Then take a few deep breaths and savor that word or phrase as God's message to you today.

Read the passage again out loud and slowly, listening this time for the way that the word or phrase **connects with either your personal life or the life of our church**. Again, rest in what you hear for a few moments.

Read the passage again a third time, **allowing your heart to respond** to what you hear honestly. Take a few minutes to pray and tell God how you feel about it.

**Rest in the love and presence of God** and his provision for you and for our church. May you know God's peace this week!

**Parents**, invite your children to listen with you to God's word and to share what they hear.

Psalm 100:1-5

we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give

thanks to him and praise his name.

Jesus said again, "I tell you the truth; I am the gate for the sheep. All who ever came before me were thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. He will come in and go out, and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full. I am the Good Shepherd. The Good Shepherd lays down His life for the sheep."

Jesus is our Shepherd. He wants us to hear His voice. He promises to be with us as He leads us, as we "come and go." He wants us to have life, and have it to the full, knowing that He is the Good Shepherd and that He laid down His life for us.
