Lric Blythe (pictured on the cover) joined the staff of First Pres as Worship Leader for the Way service as a result of our search for a replacement for Victoria Chaplain, who decided she wanted to worship at the church where her husband serves. Eric is a native South Floridian, having graduated from Jupiter Christian School and Palm Beach State College. His first full time job after school was as a paramedic for Tenet Healthcare at Palm Beach Gardens Emergency Room. During that time he realized his true calling was to utilize his musical talents and his leadership abilities in ministry.

While he was still working in the ER, he was presented with an opportunity to become the Director of Music and Community Development at a growing church plant in downtown West Palm Beach, called Truth Point Church. served there for 7 years, where he grew a music team from 5 people to 35 skilled and diverse volunteers and assembled a gospel choir averaging 20-30 members that performed around 4 times a year. As the Director of Community Development, he created a partnership between Truth Point Church and Bridges Learning Academy, a local ESL school, resulting in a total of 70 regular volunteers and the assistance of many refuge families. He also created an organization called Serve Our City which provided an electronic platform to church members for volunteer opportunities. This resulted in partnerships with 5 different local non-profits, as well as a substantial increase in monthly volunteer hours through Truth Point Church.

Eric can play several musical instruments, but guitar is his favorite. He has a collection of 10 guitars, several which adorn his office at the church. He also loves to write, arrange and retune hymns and contemporary songs. One of his favorite hobbies is spear fishing. He and his wife, Stacie, have two sons, Bear (4) and Finley (6 months) and a daughter Indy (2 ½). Prior to having children, Stacie and Eric spent a lot of time traveling. They have climbed and hiked their way through many places, most notably Patagonia (Argentina and Chile) and New Zealand.

He is a very gregarious, helpful and upbeat person that in his first two months of working at First Pres, has made a wonderful impression with the entire staff and the congregants he has met. When you have a chance to see Eric, introduce yourself. You will be glad you did!


Kinancial Focus

One of the responsibilities in my role as the Church Administrator is to encourage our congregation to grow in their faith by challenging them through the articles I write about stewardship, money and giving. I study extensively what the Bible says about these topics. One of the most remarkable stories is found in the book of Exodus, chapters 35 and 36. Israel had been out of slavery for only a few months, but God instructed Moses that he needed to gather all the congregations and asked them to take on the massive task of building the tabernacle. The tabernacle was to be the center of Israel's life because it was there that people would approach God. Exodus 35:4-5 states: "Moses said to all the congregation of the Israelites: This is the thing that the Lord has commanded: Take from among you an offering to the Lord; let whoever is of a generous heart bring the Lord's offering: gold, silver and bronze." Considering the Israelites were just released from slavery, it makes one wonder where they got these precious metals. When Israel left Egypt, they took with them all the gold, jewels and other valuables that they could carry (Exodus 12:35-36) as the Lord had given the people favor in the sight of the Egyptians. (This only seems fair since they were slaves for 400 years!)

Note that the Lord asked for a freewill offering; this wasn't the required tithe. He appealed to people with generous hearts; only those who were willing to give were allowed to participate. It is a privilege to give to, and be part of, the Lord's work. God loves cheerful givers (2 Cor 9:7). Our giving should be from love and generosity, not a sense of obligation. Those Israelites whose hearts were stirred gave with great enthusiasm because they knew how important their giving was to the completion of God's house, and their enthusiasm spread to others. As everyone got involved in giving, they kept bringing Moses the freewill offerings every morning. Here is the best part of this story, as described in Exodus 36:5-7. It reached the point where the builders and craftsmen said they had more than they needed and told Moses to instruct the people to stop giving! I'm sure a pastor has never said that to his congregation!


The lesson from this story is that if we as a church want to achieve everything God is calling us to do, we need everyone giving, not under compulsion, but with joyful hearts. In the times we are living in now, people need the message of hope that only Jesus brings, and with enough resources, First Pres can make a big impact for Christ in our community and the whole world.

FIRST PRES CHURCH APP



We now have a church app for your smart phone. On it you can listen to the latest sermon, devotional or testimony, see the church directory, give online easily and securely, see your giving history, and contact us with questions or prayer requests.

To obtain the phone app, on your smartphone, go to the App Store. Search for "MinistryOne." The logo is a white cross with a purple background. Install it on your phone. It will then ask you to "Find Your Church." Enter our church's zipcode, 33408, and our church name will display. Click "Select This Church." If you are currently in our church's database, you can click on the Profile box and enter your email and phone number. You will then be given a validation code. Enter it. You will then be able to access the church directory. If you are not in the church's database, you may complete the profile information which will be sent to our membership secretary for approval.

Please note that you cannot use the app to watch our livestream service on Sundays as it is happening. To watch our livestream service, you need to go to the YouTube button on the home screen of our website, www.firstpresnpb.org, or search our church name wherever you watch the YouTube channel. The current day's service shows up on the church app after it is edited and published the following day.

GLOBAL CHURCH PLANTING

A significant focus of First Pres' Global Mission Team is investing in pastors who are planting churches all around the world. It is no secret that one of the most effective ways to impact people with the Good News of the Gospel is through starting new churches. In this brief article I want to answer several questions about our Global Church Planting emphasis.

1. How did First Pres' Mission Committee decide to focus on global church planting?

The context for this answer is related to when First Pres switched to the ECO, or Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians, denomination. This took place in 2012. When we began in our new denomination, we made a decision that we must embrace the values of ECO. One of those values was church planting, or starting new expressions of faith communities. We had very little experience in the way of starting new churches, but we did have a great history of supporting pastors in the global church who are serving around the world. So, it made sense that our first venture in church planting was in the global arena. We made connections with pastors through Redeemer Presbyterian Church's global church planting initiative. These pastors have all been through a rigorous screening process and had been trained by Redeemer.

2. Who was our first global church planter?

Our first official global church planter was Alex Deuscher from Berlin. When we met Alex, he was single and serving in the Eastern part of Berlin. Since we began supporting him, he married his wife, Shannan, and they have one child, Ollie, and another on the way.

3. How many global church planters do we currently support?

We currently support seven global church plants! They are as follows:

- Alex and Shannan Deuscher in Berlin.
- Hannah and her husband, Valery, in Berlin.
- Alex Pipilios and his wife, Iliana, in Athens, Greece.
- Julio and Olga Chiang in Lima, Peru.
- Cienfuegos, Cuba church plant.
- Trinidad, Cuba church plant.
- Pastor Mauro in Sao Paulo, Brazil.



4. Doesn't First Pres support other global church pastors in addition to the church planters?

Yes, we do support a number of pastors doing ministry around the world. A number of years ago we began a slight shift to support missionaries from a variety of global locations. There has been a shift taking place in what the church calls "missions." This shift recognizes that the best way to reach a nation is for people from that nation to do the work of missions. One of those pastors we support is Antonio and Ruth Reyes in Merida, Mexico. We also support missionaries like John and Lynn Lehn who are partnering with a pastor in Croatia; Steve Johnson who is doing outreach in Budapest, Hungary; and Jordan and Michelle Barry who are serving in North Africa.

5. What is the gathering of church planters that First Pres sponsors every three years?

Three years ago, the Mission Committee invited all of our church planters to come to North Palm for a week. The global planters and their wives were invited. It was an amazing time of building relationships, reconnecting with our partners, and providing some training and encouragement. One of the blessing from this time was that our church planters connected with each other and built good relationships. We learned from this event that church planting is extremely difficult and that First Pres is strategically positioned to provide encouragement and support for our partners in ministry, and with their marriages and families.

This past February we held the Global Church Planter Gathering as a virtual event. We gathered for 2 ½ hours for three days and provided support, training, prayer, and encouragement for our partners in ministry. We invited several of them to lead a training session so they are learning from each other. And it was very timely with each of our planters feeling the effects of the pandemic. We invited not only our planters, but also the global pastors we support.

Thank you for all you are doing to support our global mission initiatives and especially supporting our global church planters.

STUDENT MINISTRIES

We most recently focused on the sacraments of baptism and communion. The students and mentors are continuing to meet to discuss these important topics and build relationships.

As I reflect on things, I thought of how I might have reacted at 14 years if placed face-to-face with an unfamiliar gent pushing 80, sitting across from me at a table in a church fellowship hall. Jameson is a mature young man, quietly confident and unintimidated by the situation. I learned about some of his interests, his hero (his dad), and a vision he has for the future. I was also encouraged that when I asked what I might pray for, it was nothing for himself, but for a grandmother facing some health issues."
